The Technology Fee has not been increased since 2016. Over the past seven years, IT services has leveraged the fee to provide comprehensive student support services, improve student experiences, and enhance student success. The fee increase will be used to offset increases in operational expenses associated with technical services (salaries and student employee wages), improvements to our cyber security program (DUO, KnowBe4), the enhanced learning ecosystem (Canvas, Zoom, et al), enhanced NAU-Flex classrooms, WiFi capabilities, and essential student software (Adobe, Google, Microsoft).

Student Consultation (Please describe the method and outcomes of student consultation)

We have reviewed with both undergraduate (2/23/23) and graduate (2/20/23) student governments and received positive comments about the importance and need for continued investment in IT infrastructure to support the student experience.

Through our tiered academic college fee structure and associated elimination of all undergraduate course and program fees, we are better supporting student momentum, attainment, and success, improving our ability to offer equitable postsecondary value, more clearly demonstrating our value proposition to students and their families, and making costs simpler and more predictable.

Justification (Please provide a brief statement on what the proposal is intended to pay for and how much of the costs will be covered by the incremental revenue)

College fee revenue funds a broad set of needs and associated initiatives that enable NAU to offer high-quality instruction; expand academic support, advising, and student services; support needs for instructional equipment, supplies, specialized software, and experiences supporting post-graduation professional success; and improve instructional environments and facilities. Base fee amounts are halved for part-time students and increased by 50% for non-resident students. The increase proposed here will enable us to continue funding these needs and sustain high-quality services in light of increases to operational costs.

Student Consultation (Please describe the evidence, method and outcomes of student consultation)

Our proposal reflects input and consultation with the Associated Students of Northern Arizona University that contribute to a shared understanding of the importance of a modest fee increase to continue meeting our student success goals.

The Honors Program Fee has historically funded programming in the Honors College, including guest speakers, course-related travel, conference travel for individual students, and peer leadership programs. More recently, the fee has provided funding for the salaries for Honors instruction and student support staff as well as the College's portion of the debt service obligation for the academic facility of the Honors College Residence.

Justification (Please provide a brief statement on what the proposal is intended to pay for and how much of the costs will be covered by the incremental revenue)

Revenue from this fee increase will continue to enable high-quality instruction and services to Honors students, including Honors Ambassadors, Honors Writing Center Tutors, and Honors Peer Mentors. The fee has remained stable over the past four years, so this increase is largely designed to help deal with inflationary pressures and maintain current levels of programming and student support.

Student Consultation (Please describe the method and outcomes of student consultation)

We sent a Qualtrix survey to about 80 current students to gauge their views on a proposed increase of the Honors Program Fee by 3%. We asked one question—Do you support this fee increase if it will help us maintain our current level of programming?—and left space for additional comments. The response rate was just over 25%, with 70% in favor, 15% against, and 15% undecided. Those in favor noted the modest size of the increase and the value of Honors. Others wanted more information, or for Honors to find other sources of income to fund services.

The program fee supports student expenses related to our specialized needs related to the high-quality education of health professionals. The students directly benefit from these funds during their time in the program and allow us to meet the operational costs for our DPT programs. The program fee is paid by the students for each fall and spring semester they are in the program, but not summer, for a total of five semesters of program fee assessment.

Justification (Please provide a brief statement on what the proposal is intended to pay for and how much of the costs will be covered by the incremental revenue)

The proposed increase in fees and consistency in fees across campuses and delivery modes will allow us to cover costs related to: staff and faculty to support instruction and student attainment and success; operations; instructional labs for both residential and hybrid DPT programs; simulation labs for residential and hybrid DPT programs; equipment maintenance and repair; and specialized software needs. The new fee amount will be applied to students starting Fall 2023 with the current fee applying to existing students.

Student Consultation (Please describe the method and outcomes of student consultation)

We consulted with currently enrolled students through two different means: an online survey and a virtual meeting with students from both the Flagstaff and Phoenix campuses. While students expressed concern over a fee increase, they also shared extensive opportunities to improve the program through updated technological support and equipment, increased access to simulation labs, and expanded access to simulation lab opportunities—all of which are needs the increase in program fees will allow us to fulfill.
